What Can We Do For You?

One of my big dilemmas as pastor is to try to figure out how we can best serve you, the people of St. Catharine. Over almost 38 years of ministry and various parishes, things continue to evolve and change. There were times and situations when the church was a provider of a strong social base when people would gather for meals, dances and other get-togethers. In some ways there is always a social element to what we do, but now it is more about doing ministry side by side, as well as outreach beyond the parish. Of course the strongest social element is in worship and sharing faith. Ultimately, we can all pray to our God, personally and individually, but there is something to be said for coming together and lifting and supporting each other's faith.

A big conviction of mine is to continue to develop adult faith in ways beyond Mass. Our parish's *Family Religious Education* program has become very popular. In the program, parents receive a separate presentation as their children are being taught in CCD. This year during Lent, and already reserved for next year, we will be having a *Parish Mission* where the entire parish can engage in a mini-retreat for a few evenings. In addition to the mission, I will be presenting a *4-part Lenten Series* on elements that are key to our faith. We will look at challenging concepts and questions that confront us as Catholic Christians and no topic will be avoided. There will be an opportunity to anonymously or publicly ask questions about anything that is unclear or something to which you have never received an adequate response to in the past.

These events, and the continual opportunity to do things, both for and beyond the parish, remain a constant. The other missing elements are things that you can help me discover. Please let me know what you are thinking, whether it is through the "Ask Fr. Tom" link on the parish website, the Suggestion Box in the narthex, by emailing me (tsw48@hotmail.com), calling me, or when I see you at weekend Mass.

As my above title suggests, what can your church do for you? Because after all, that is what we are here for.

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

*The kingdom of God is at hand.
Repent, and believe in the gospel.*

- Mark 1:15

Today's Readings

First Reading The people of Nineveh believed God and turned from their evil ways (Jonah 3:1-5, 10).

Psalms Teach me your ways, O Lord (Psalm 25).

Second Reading The world in its present form is passing away (1 Corinthians 7:29-31).

Gospel This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand (Mark 1:14-20).

Today we encounter readings that already have a Lenten feel about them. Nineveh undergoes a forty-day fast, the psalmist reminds us that God alone can show sinners the way, Paul shows us how fleeting the things and events of this world are, and Jesus cries out "Repent!" before he calls his new followers. "Come after me," Jesus says, but if we are to truly live out the commands and demands of our discipleship through baptism, we must first know our need for conversion, our repentance, our need to believe in the gospel fully.

Today's Gospel opens with the stark reminder of what befell John the Baptist for completely living out his vocation as the herald of Christ and the gospel: he was arrested, imprisoned, and martyred. Though few of us will experience consequences that extreme, we must all be ready to risk some sort of rejection as, heeding the call of Jesus, we live out the kingdom of God at hand, repent of our sins, and believe in the good news of salvation.
